




Finding your way around the Brooks Building:

Speakers



Rev Steve Chalke MBE

Steve Chalke founded the Oasis Trust in 1985 with a vision to build inclusive local communities.

Oasis is now one of the largest charities in the UK, as well as working in seven other countries. It provides housing, education - now a Multi-Agency Trust with 52 academy schools - healthcare, various other community-building initiatives and more recently working with the Ministry of Justice building and creating the UK's first secure school - Oasis Restore, which is due to open at the end of 2023.

Steve is also an author, speaker, former UN Special Advisor on Human Trafficking and a Baptist minister. He holds an MBE and various honorary fellowships, all awarded for his work in social inclusion and justice. He continues to lead Oasis and is the founding minister of Oasis Church, Waterloo in central London - a place of inclusion where all are welcome.



Drew Dalton (He/Him) is a Senior Lecturer in Sociology and the Programme Leader for the MSc Inequality and Society at the University of Sunderland.

He has significant industry experience in the Third Sector, human rights and in education. He has been Chair of several organisations including those that have highlighted LGBT+ histories and those that support LGBT+ Muslims.

Currently he is the Founder and Chair of ReportOUT, a global human rights charity for sexual and gender minorities across the globe.

Safe Space




Our aim is to make our conference as accessible as possible, in every sense of the word.



CPDme Development for Life

Andrew created CPDme in 2009 as part of his master's research to identify barriers to why we take part in CPD, but often don't take time to record, reflect and retain an accurate record. Since then he has supported over 1 million professionals around the world and now engages the largest CPD recording platform across Europe, supplying organisations such as British Airways, Air Ambulance bases, and NHS Ambulance Trusts, to list but a few.

Andrew has kindly offered attendees a complimentary membership to his platform **www.CPDme.com** and the chance to win two all-inclusive tickets to EMS World in New Orleans with him and the team in September 2023.
